Access To ProviderHub Is Changing

As previously communicated in the June Provider Press, effective August 2, 2014, claim status, benefits and eligibility information will no longer be available on Provider Web Self-Service (ProviderHub). This information is currently available on Availity's 5010 HIPAA compliant Web Portal, and after the transition date, Availity will be the only portal resource for claim status and eligibility information for Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Minnesota (Blue Cross).

Transitioning these services to Availity will allow for secure portal transactions, streamline workflows and increase efficiencies with Blue Cross and other health plans.
