Pharmacy Benefit Update – Diabetes Testing Supplies

Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Minnesota and Blue Plus (Blue Cross) is committed to providing subscribers with safe, quality, pharmacy care.

Effective January 1, 2018, the exclusive glucose test strips covered for commercial subscribers will be the Ascensia Diabetes Care portfolio products. Other glucose testing supplies will be excluded from the pharmacy benefit. Subscribers must use the glucose test strips that are covered under the pharmacy benefit plan or pay full price for continued use of their current glucose test strips.

Affected subscribers who recently received glucose test strips that will be excluded from coverage will be notified and directed to contact their providers to discuss the covered glucose test strip choices. At no charge, affected subscribers are being offered a choice of a covered blood glucose monitoring system for a limited time. A summary of the excluded test strips and covered alternative test strips are listed below.
