This <u>plan</u> has an embedded <u>deductible</u> . If you have other family members on the <u>plan</u> , each family member must meet their own individual deductible until the total amount of <u>deductible</u> expenses paid by all family members meets the overall family <u>deductible</u> .

Does this plan provide Minimum Essential Coverage? Yes
